DOUBLE HONOUR FOR DIANE

IANE Salisbury has received a double award in the 'Your Champions' competition organised by North Wales Independent Press & Scottish Power. Not only was she voted North Wales Woman of the Year, but so impressed the judges that they gave her a special award for her achievements.

For the last 10 years, Diane has worked 3 days a week as a volunteer in the Scope in Llandudno, ensuring that clothes are clean, pressed and mended before going on sale and helping customers.

Diane attends numerous committees and helps organise social events for the disabled. She spends one day a week at a dropin centre at Llandudno Junction for people with disabilities - a facility she helped start last year and of which she is vice-chairman. It has filled a real need and about 25 people call in each week to listen to talks on issues of interest to them. She sits on the transport for the

disabled committee run by Community Voluntary Services and is concerned about issues such as taxis charging a handling fee.

She is also on a panel advising Conwy Social Services on ways of improving life for people with



disabilities and, of course, has been a member of our own committee for several years.

Diane lives a full social life too. She is chairman of the Smile Club for ladies with disabilities and rarely misses a meeting of the Llandudno and Colwyn Bay Endeavour Clubs. She is a steward at the North Wales Theatre and

on Sundays sometimes reads the Lesson at holy Trinity Church in Llandudno.

For the last two years, Diane has lived independently in her own flat. She is an avid *Coronation Street* fan and jigsaw puzzle addict - but admits that she finds it difficult to find the time to finish a puzzle!

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

esearchers in Ireland studying the causes of spina bifida have found a further genetic risk factor.

A genetic variation in a folate-related gene is associated with an increase in the risk that a woman will have a baby with spina bifida or another neural tube defect.

These findings have been made possible by the cooperation of Irish families like yours taking part in the study. By including ASBAH members in England and Wales, the researchers will be able to verify if the same genes are involved throughout the UK and identify further

risk factors.

ASBAH would like to encourage you to take part in the study, which asks individuals with spina bifida and, if possible, their parents, to collect their own DNA by taking cheek swabs using a hometesting kit. It is simple, quick and painless. All information given will be held in the strictest confidence.

So far, 582 ASBAH families have agreed to participate in the study and 364 families have returned their samples.

The more families who take part, the greater the chance of finding an important result.

JOAN BEE

JOAN BEE died on 25th December. The following extract is from a Tribute given by Mike Mason at Joan's funeral.

Joan and her husband Ron began their search for solutions to the immediate needs of children and parents of people with spina bifida and hydrocephalus, after the birth of their son, Will. They did so with a keen eye on the future, putting in place arrangements that would ensure that the needs of disabled children would be appropriately responded to; their rights would be promoted, they would be treated with respect and ultimately be enabled to take up their place in an accepting and integrated society.

It was when Ron and Joan joined forces with other parents that they were able to work towards a structure in North Wales that would provide support for parents, families and people with spina bifida and hydrocephalus and North Wales ASBAH was formed. Progressively, Joan was to make her own mark. She came to know the needs of members and the Association backwards holding, as she did over many years, the roles of Secretary, Treasurer and Chair.

True leadership can be evidenced in those who, without counting the cost, not only see a need, but do something positive about meeting that need, sticking at it, encouraging others along the way, but also protecting what has been created. Joan did all of this, quietly and yet with purpose.

She also had courage and vision. When there were financial challenges, she negotiated a closer relationship with the National body, resulting in financial support towards the Fieldwork service in North Wales that she had helped establish and knew was so valued by our members. When the spirit was weak and there was a "wobble" of confidence within the Association. we emerged energised by her courage in challenging the commitment of members regarding the very continuation of our efforts in North Wales. Joan's vision was perhaps most clearly seen in the effort she made many years ago by encouraging the Local Associations in Wales to share their experience and create a voice for ASBAH in Wales. Today we have a Welsh based organization, able to speak out on behalf of members, influencing service provision and policy development.

We give thanks for Joan, who through her compassion and tenacity did so much to positively influence the future for so many.


