BEST MUM MENAI WINS STAR PRIZE

"Thanks a million" was the message from Daily Post competition winner Menai Williams.

Menai, from Llandaniel, Anglesey, gave up her career as a nurse to look after her daughter, Llinos, who has spina bifida and hydrocephalus. Twenty-year-old Llinos has undergone 65 operations and last winter Menai travelled to the Walton Centre for Neurosurgery in Liverpool nearly everyday for 10 weeks to be with her - clocking up over 16,000 miles!

"Until Llinos was 18 I was allowed to stay at a hotel in the hospital grounds. Afterwards it was £37 a night, so it was cheaper to travel

every day. I was able to help Llinos with physiotherapy because the nurses were so busy."

Menai was voted 'Community Hero for 2003' by Daily Post readers and received two tickets to hear bass baritone Bryn Terfel and tenor Jose Carreras sing at the Faenol Festival in August.

"It was one big thrill from start to finish. We had two of the best seats, six rows from the front - so close we could see the expressions on the singers' faces" said Menai.

Llinos comments "I'll never be able to thank Mum enough. She's worth her weight in gold".

HELP WITH SCHOOL **UNIFORMS**

Grants are available towards buying school uniforms for children attending secondary school if you receive:

- income support
- income based Jobseekers Allowance
- child tax credit (not WTC) with an income below £13,230
 - widowed parents allowance (in some circumstances)

The grant is £35 for each eligible child for the first year and £28 for each subsequent year. An application form can be obtained from the school or from the local education authority.

EDUCATIONAL MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE (EMA)

An EMA can be paid to parents who receive the benefits listed above and have children in the 6th Form. An EMA of £150 is paid for each academic year. It is intended to help towards the cost of books and other educational expenses. It is disregarded as income in the calculation of other benefits. Contact your local education authority.
