
The point was not lost on me that the need that the Association has addressed over the years continues, in terms of the provision of practical, emotional and, when necessary, financial support.

31 March 2012 marks the end of an important and influential era in supporting people with spina bifida and hydrocephalus in North Wales. For many years, the North Wales ASBAH committee and volunteers have worked tirelessly to make a difference to people's lives. They've raised thousands of pounds along the way to support members, but it hasn't been only about fundraising; it has also been about making sure that others, such as those working in health and social care, education, the town and county councils and the general public know about spina bifida and hydrocephalus, and understand what life is like for us and for our families.

NWASBAH has seen many babies born, watched them grow into young children and teenagers, and has seen them flourish as they develop into adults - and it has offered information and guidance to them and their families to ensure that they move towards their goals. I know that there have been sad times but also many happy times, and NWASBAH has been there through the thick and the thin, lending support whenever it could.
